We celebrate Jamaica's heritage this month, but not everyone can make it to the various functions, and so expressing our appreciation of and celebrating our heritage may be done through fashion. Fortunately we don't have to travel far to purchase crafts because most resorts and cities have craft villages or tourist stores.
