Jamaica could host Scottish Highland Games

Jamaica could play host to a Scottish Highland Games in 2012 following a feasibility currently been conducted on the island by Lord Jamie Sempill from Edinburgh in Scotland.

The Scot added that would be an opportunity both for his countrymen to visit Jamaica but also for Jamaicans to reconnect with their Scottish heritage. Included in the three-day games are athletics, music and dance events. "Given the Jamaican people's outstanding reputation in athletics, music and dance, we see that there could be some quirky fusion between Scottish culture and Jamaican culture," said Director of Tourism, John Lynch. "Such an event also has a huge potential to drive visitor business to Jamaica and create worldwide publicity." During his time on the island, Sempill will meet with both Lynch and Minister of Tourism Ed Bartlett and visit major sports facilities including the Trelawny Multi-Purpose facility.
